Adjective	Preposition	Meaning	Example
excited	about	對...感到興奮	The kids are really excited about visiting the amusement park tomorrow.
happy		對...感到開心	Danny won three medals at Sports Day. His parents were happy about his achievement.
upset		難過的	Michelle's brother is moving to London. She is upset about his leaving.
worried		擔心	Patrick failed the exam again. He is worried about getting punished by his mum.
sorry		對...感到抱歉	Daniel was sorry about breaking his friend's vase by accident.
angry		對...感到生氣	The students were throwing things around when the teacher entered the classroom. She was very angry about their manners.
ashamed	of	慚愧	The football team lost again at the home stadium. Their fans were ashamed of the defeat.
proud		引以為傲	The musician's latest album is sold out. He is proud of his music.
afraid		害怕	Chris lost his wallet once. He is afraid of losing it again so he is very cautious now.
supportive		支持	Alex has tried his hardest for the exam. Whatever the result, his parents will be supportive of him.
scared		害怕	Phoebe is not a brave girl. She is scared of watching horror movies alone.
angry		生氣	She never meant to hurt your feelings. Please don't be angry with her.
bored	with	厭倦了	Jason is bored with playing the same video game over and over again.
disappointed		因...感到失望	The audience was disappointed with the singer's performance.
pleased		因...而快慰	Derek finished all the homework by himself before his mother came home. She was pleased with his hard work.
happy		開心	George is happy with his decision to sell his video games. He can stay focused on his studies now.
satisfied		滿足的	Carl achieved full marks for his exam. He is satisfied with the result.
delighted		為...感到高興	The park has been rebuilt. The residents are delighted with its new facilities.
