advantage 益處	disadvantage 短處	Your broken arm will leave you at a <b><u>disadvantage</u></b> in the sailing race.
agree 同意	disagree 不同意	I <b><u>disagree</u></b> with you on that point – meat can form part of a healthy diet.
continue 繼續	discontinue 中斷	Students aren't really buying lined paper anymore as they do almost everything on computers, so I suggest we <b><u>discontinue</u></b> production of lined paper.
connect 連接	disconnect 斷開	Please <b><u>disconnect</u></b> from the internet while you complete the test.
content 滿足的	discontent 不滿	Up and down the country, there is <b><u>discontent</u></b> with what the government is proposing.
honest 誠實的	dishonest 不誠實的	She was a <b><u>dishonest</u></b> girl and no-one trusted her.
loyal 忠誠	disloyal 不忠誠的	You have been <b><u>disloyal</u></b> to our team, and so we have decided that you will no longer play for us.
order 整齊	disorder 混亂	Following the earthquake, there was chaos and <b><u>disorder</u></b> .
comfort 舒適	discomfort 不舒適	Lying in the hospital bed, Sarah was in a lot of <b><u>discomfort</u></b> .
appear 出現	disappear 消失	I wish all of my problems would just <b><u>disappear</u></b> !
moral 有道德的	immoral 不道德的	'What you did was totally <b><u>immoral</u></b> . I cannot forgive you.'
perfect 完美的	imperfect 有瑕疵的	Even the most honest witness has an <b><u>imperfect</u></b> memory.

polite 有禮貌的	impolite 失禮的	It is <b><u>impolite</u></b> to interrupt when someone is speaking.
patient 有耐心的	impatient 急躁的	'Don't be so <b><u>impatient</u></b> , Sarah! Wait for your turn!'
pure 純淨的	impure 不純潔的	The water was <b><u>impure</u></b> as some chemicals had been spilled into it.
mortal 死的	immortal 不死的	No human is <b><u>immortal</u></b> .
possible 可能的	impossible 不可能的	It will be almost <b><u>impossible</u></b> to get a band to play at our wedding on such short notice.
proper 適當的	improper 不適當的	In England, it is <b><u>improper</u></b> to place your elbows on the dinner table.
efficient 效率高的	inefficient 無效率的	Writing all of the labels by hand will be really <b><u>inefficient</u></b> .
appropriate 恰當的	inappropriate 不恰當的	It's <b><u>inappropriate</u></b> to give you my mobile phone number.
sufficient 充足的	insufficient 不足的	There are <b><u>insufficient</u></b> funds in the account for us to set up a new restaurant.
fertile 肥沃的	infertile 貧瘠的	The ground near the swamp is <b><u>infertile</u></b> .
correct 正確的	incorrect 錯的	That answer is <b><u>incorrect</u></b> . Please try again.
sane 理智的	insane 不理智的	Are you <b><u>insane</u></b> ? That is a very bad idea!
considerate 體諒的	inconsiderate 不體諒別人的	It was <b><u>inconsiderate</u></b> of Tom to leave me all of the washing up to do.
visible 明顯的	invisible 看不見的	Sometimes I feel as if I am <b><u>invisible</u></b> as no-one seems to listen to what I say.
adequate 足夠的	inadequate 不足夠的	I am disappointed: your work so far this year has been <b><u>inadequate</u></b> .
dependent 依賴的	independent 獨立的	Simon ran for office as an <b><u>independent</u></b> candidate.
tie 綁	untie 解開	Please can you help me to <b><u>untie</u></b> my dog's lead from this post?
popular 流行的	unpopular 不流行的	Jane was an <b><u>unpopular</u></b> girl and this made her unhappy.

common 普遍的	uncommon 不尋常的	Red hair and green eyes are beautiful, though <b>uncommon</b> , traits.
certain 肯定	uncertain 不確定的	After seeing rain falling outside, the chance of us making a trip to the beach was <b>uncertain</b> .
fit 適宜的	unfit 不適宜的	After shouting at the children, Mary felt she was <b>unfit</b> to be a mother.
like 喜歡	dislike 不喜歡	I really <b>dislike</b> green tea ice cream.
reasonable 合理的	unreasonable 不合理的	Sarah's dad thought she was <b>unreasonable</b> for asking for time off school to go on a shopping trip.
conscious 神志清醒的	unconscious 失去知覺的	Ben collapsed and lay <b>unconscious</b> on the ground.
faithful 忠實的	unfaithful 不忠的	He was an <b>unfaithful</b> husband, and often treated his wife badly.
aware 意識到的	unaware 未察覺到的	Red riding hood skipped merrily along the path, <b>unaware</b> of the hungry wolf lurking behind her.
calculate 計算	miscalculate 計算錯誤	Jake had <b>miscalculated</b> the route and it would take him far longer than he had anticipated to get back home.
fortune 運氣	misfortune 不幸	I had the <b>misfortune</b> of spending the afternoon with Sally. She would not stop moaning.
manage 管理	mismanage 管理不善	Due to a lack of supervision, this situation has been terribly <b>mismanaged</b> .
match 相配	mismatch 使配合不當	Her socks were <b>mismatched</b> .
